

## Jose Bustos

Most of you know Jose Bustos that runs our Ninos Adelante Organization, but many likely do not know his story. My wife and I had a good conversation with him recently and we asked him many questions about his past and how he got to where he is today. We found it a very interesting story, so I thought I would try and share it with you.

Jose was born in the mountains in a small ranch called "El Faisan" where he lived with his parents: Don Ramon Bustos and Dona Victoria Islas, where the closest town was "Vallecitos". They had to come to Vallecitos that provided all they needed and it was the only place around where they had an elementary school. This meant they had to go to Vallecitos walking or riding horse for five hours. Then Jose's parents had to stay at the ranch to work to maintain 8 daughters and 5 sons, 13 kids in total. For that reason, the oldest daughter was the one in charge of taking care the younger siblings by the time they started elementary school.

They had to travel every weekend to el Faisan to help the parents maintain the ranch. During this time, most of the kids only studied until 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> grade, basically to learn how to read and write. Don Ramon and Dona Victoria considered it was enough education since they themselves never attended school.

When Jose was a young boy, he was walking along a path up in the woods on the land his family owned where he grew up in the mountains. One day he found a piece of paper that was quite colorful. He did not know what it was, so he brought it home and gave it to his parents. It turned out to be a \$50 peso bill (that was worth a lot of money in those days). His Father quickly bought a pig to start raising animals to feed the family. At the insistence of his Mother (after all, he was the one that found the money), he was given his first pair of shoes. A great start for a great guy!

Jose's Father wanted him to stay in the mountains and become a farmer, but one day the principal of a new school that was being founded in Zihuantanejo visited Vallecitos to convince the parents to send their kids to school. It was then, after one trip to town, Jose had a great desire to attend school. His Father took him to town to find a school. He needed transportation but did not know what a taxi was. Jose said it must be one of those white cars because they all look alike! He was allowed to pursue his dream of an education. He started in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade and stayed for the first six months with cousins where he had to walk half an hour to get to school. After that he found bed and food at a teacher's house and at that time, he moved in with his teacher's family. For his room and board, his job was to watch over the chickens and a cow. One day while tending to the cow, he fell asleep and lost the cow. After several long hours of searching, he finally found the cow. He was very relieved when he did. Along with the cow, he had to get up at 5:30am to raise the chickens as well. He was 13-14 years old at that time and he lived with this family for 2 years. In high school, he worked as a mechanic to earn money and support himself, but it was difficult to do so. He then moved in with another family who offered him a job at a Taco stand. That is where Jose got his start in the food service business. While working at the taco stand, he met people who worked at hotels and he got interested in getting a job in a hotel, even though he wasn't old enough. He learned how to be a hard worker at a very young age. At the age of 17, in 1982 he was a dishwasher at the Las Brisas Hotel. It was difficult to keep up with 8 hours of work and 7 hours at school because he hardly had time to sleep. By then he rented a small room and became independent. In 1983, Jose started working at Sheraton hotel now called Barcelo as a bus boy, where in no time, he became a waiter. He worked there until 1987. At first, because his English was not the best, a customer would ask him a question about the menu and he had to make up an answer or try to explain it as best he could. The other waiters would stand by and laugh at him when he could not explain the menu item correctly. Since that day, Jose memorized the menu and would watch the cook during the preparation to insure he could answer questions correctly and honestly. The other waiters soon were asking him for help to explain things to their customers. A star was born!

Later in 1987 he had visions of great things upon hearing the stories about people working in Cancun. That is when he made the decision to leave Zihua and make his way in Cancun. He worked there for about 16 months before he realized that it was better to be near family (and things were not that great in Cancun) and decided to return to Zihua.

In 1988 he returned to Zihua and worked at the Las Brisas for 6 months and then went to the Dorado Pacifica as a waiter for another 6 months. The problem was during the high season things were good, but in the off-season things were tough. In 1990, he worked at the Omni Hotel (now the Park Royal) and stayed there until 1992. From that point on, he started at the Fontan Hotel where he is today.

He met a guy one day that he became good friends with. That guy was Bob Albright. Bob was already friends with some of Jose's cousins, so Jose was a natural fit.

Bob and Marilyn brought some of their friends to the restaurant where Jose was working and there was an instant connection. They all quickly became friends and started going to the beach to grill lobsters on Jose's day off. This group of people turned out to be Bob & Marilyn Albright, Jack & Adrienne Baldwin and Bob & Leone Leighton (my parents).

During the following years, Jose got involved in Ninos Adelante. It was a "grass roots" organization without many kids. The early organizers soon saw the opportunity to expand and eventually, the then President, Ty Bujold, went through the process to make us a 501 (C) 3 Minnesota Non-Profit in 1998. As they say, the rest is history!


sponsors Nivea, where you enter at a business management emulator on internet and we were semi-finalist. So I started to get interested on business.
