USA TAX LAW QCD – DIRECT IRA CONTRIBUTIONS

With the tax law changes and the new limits on itemized deductions, those sponsors that are 70 1/2 or older can now arrange to make contributions directly from their IRA's to 501(c) charities such as Friends of Niños Adelante. This can be structured to decrease your taxable IRA amount. To accomplish this, tell your IRA fiduciary who/what/where to make the donation (you do not touch it). They will then give you a letter acknowledging they sent it, and the charity should give you a letter saying they received the contribution from your IRA. This distribution then counts towards your RMDs (Required Minimum Distributions), and if your tax advisor has the two letters they can deduct that amount from the IRA distributions that are taxable. As always, consult your tax advisor for details and to confirm this is applicable to your specific situation.

English Classes Brighten Niños Adelante Students Futures

Friends of Niños Adelante has long understood the need and opportunity to improve the English language skills of its students not only to bridge the communications gap between sponsors and students but, more importantly, to help deserving students gain access to expanded educational and job opportunities.

There are two separate and different English programs that have developed over the years. The sponsor taught classes and the formal English classes offered by Stella. They are synergistic and compliment the student's formal educational journey.

The Sponsor taught February classes.

- Conversational oriented classes offered during February to interested students.
- Volunteer Sponsors perform the teaching duties.
- No charge to the students or Sponsors of attending students
- Participant recommendations come from sponsors, parents of students, teachers and Jose
- Student's school schedules and level of commitment are monitored by Jose

Early on, the Friends of Niños Adelante sponsors who visited Zihua and spent time with their students, saw the need and the opportunity for English instruction. Formal classes offered by local schools such as The Maryland School were good but too expensive for most of our students. Ty Bujold, Shelia Yarnell, Leif Lindblom among others organized a group of volunteer Sponsors to conduct classes promoting interest in English during their Feb



visits. These classes continued through time up to a pause due to the pandemic. The structure changed somewhat with more focus on conversation and some fun stuff mixed in. Thanks to dedicated and committed fellow sponsors who selflessly give up their time, these classes were popular and well attended. 
The Formal English Classes

Formal English classes were established in 2013 and have maintained class sizes of approx. 40 students. Around a dozen students are admitted each year. Most, but not all, stick with the instruction from year to year and come away with varying degrees of English proficiency. A small percentage leave because they lose interest or drop out of school but most leave when they attend college in a distant city. Over half of the students progress to the point of some proficiency. Twenty-five students have taken one or both of the universally recognized Cambridge University B-1 and B-2 proficiency tests. The B-1 satisfies college graduation requirements while the B-2 is recognized as proof that one can use every day written and spoken English for work or study purposes.


Formal English Classes

- Offered by Stella Delgado and Teacher Ana
- Consist of two-hour classes two days per week for the 10 month academic school year
- Approximately 40 Students can be accommodated in this program
- Available to selected students from all grade levels including college
- Students are recommended for these classes by Sponsors, the conversational class teachers and Jose.
- Final selection is determined by Jose after careful consideration of a student's academic schedule & level of commitment
- Students are segregated into beginner, intermediate and advanced groups.
- The curriculum includes preparation for the internationally recognized Cambridge University English testing program.
- There is a cost of \$200 per student for the 10 months of instruction.
- The Student's sponsors are solicited to support half of this \$200 cost.
- For those students that advance and qualify to take the Cambridge tests, there is an additional cost of \$160 for the B-1 tests and \$250 for the B-2 tests that Cambridge charges. The student's sponsors are solicited to support these added costs.

For both English classes, students are responsible for any extra transportation costs they may incur to attend



classes. The biggest investment for students is their time (an extra 4 hrs of formal classes) along with their commitment and determination to make the most of the opportunity. Niños Adelante is not a school but a supporter of all its students that are enrolled in the program with the goal to provide tools that will help lead students to reach their fullest potential. Thank you to all involved, especially to all sponsors who have historically and selflessly continued to make a positive impact in the lives of such deserving young adults. You are making a difference! The resultant smiles like those of Alejandra and Donaji are the biggest reward of all!



STUDENT BREAKFAST – FEBRUARY 13, 2022

It was a Pandemic shaped Breakfast this year. The good news is, with half the number of sponsors attending it was possible to organize a safe but more intimate gathering. The not so good news is, with only half the number of sponsors attending, only half the number of students were able to meet with their sponsors. None the less, this year's event was a success.

Our preparations to stage a Pandemic influenced gathering worked out well. 




Dear Gary Steinhafel and Jocelyn Servick,
