Through Jose Bustos' fine efforts we got to meet with our kids and their families at two separate Reunions (January and February). Thanks to the fine bilingual people who contributed their services as interpreters. We look forward to repeat events in the next year. From time to time, many of us hear of heart rending stories of hardship in the Zihuatanejo area. Our or-

ganization is neither equipped nor established to provide help. Yet I know that many of you do help, in ways unrelated to your annual Niños contributions. Please read inside for more information.

Niños Computer News by Bob Albright

The administrative office in Zihuatanajo is now equipped with three relatively fast Pentium 4 desk top machines running XP operating systems. One machine is used primarily for administrative purposes employing MS Access and QuickBooks as the database and financial management tools. The other two machines are used primarily for instructional purposes. Matilda Vera, Niños Adelante's part-time data entry/office manager in Zihuatanajo along with Gary Nelson, Friends of Niños Director of IT in Sonoma, are doing a first class job of managing and disseminating information.

One Saturday a month during the school year the kids come to the office to receive their Beca payments. At that time they also receive any incoming emails from their padrinos and are able to send emails to their padrinos. The email address of the office is:

in order that we may keep the kids informed.

This past May, Jose experimented with computer instruction classes for interested kids. He was able to organize two classes of 15 kids each and things went well until the teacher, Matilda, became ill and had to abort the instructions. The program will be restarted in September when the kids are back in school.

Thus far attracting kids during their summer vacation has not been successful. In September we may also get some instructional help from Rocio Mesas, a high school computer teacher and graduate of the Niños program.

English Classes for Students

Many thanks go out to our Friends of Niños Adelante volunteer English teachers for all of their hard work. This winter's teachers included; Elsa Nelson, Anlee Schaye, Shelagh Yarnell, Leif Lindblom, MaBeth Sander son and Tyrone Bujold. Approximately 30 students attended these daily English classes over a four week period in February. We hope to involve more students in the future.

These students are able to communicate better with their sponsor families using the skills learned in these classes thanks to the hard work of the teachers.

Students attending the Niños Adelante English classes are treated to Valentines Day and end of English class parties by teachers and other

Dental Program for Niños by John and Liz Cook

Our 5th annual February dental program was once again a success thanks to Dr. John Cook. This year Dr. Cook's partner, Dr. Henry Milanowski, from Grand Rapids, Michigan, joined the efforts for two weekends. With Liz Cook's assistance and some pitching in by our two host dentists, Dr. Oliverio Soberanis and his wife, Dr. Azusena Acosta Mena, the team examined and treated 30 of our Niños. Two new serious orthodontic

cases were taken on by Dr. Acosta at half her usual fee and agreements were reached with the families of the niño and niña to contribute a small fee each month. The smiles and 'thank you's from the niños and fellow sponsors will bring the team



back in 2005. Niños Adelante expresses thanks to the Cooks, Dr. Milanowski, Dr. Soberanis and Dr. Acosta for their willingness to support and participate in this program.

Guidelines for New Sponsors

Thank you for joining us in helping to educate the brightest and the poorest students in the Zihuatanejo area! It is a truly rewarding journey.

\$200 per student pays for all of the educational needs for one year. These funds are dispersed to the students on the first Saturday of every month, September through May.

If you wish to provide Christmas and birthday gifts, we encourage amounts in the neighborhood of \$25 each.

Breakfasts are held each January and February for the sponsors, students and students' families. Sponsors pay for the student and their families breakfast (about 100 pesos a person)

Gifts to take to breakfast with Niños and families include educational items, sports items, and personal items.

This story of hardship has been brought to our attention via Liz Williams, U.S. Consular Agency and longtime active member of Friends of Niños Adelante.

Two American children whose mother was murdered by their father and he is subsequently in prison are currently being raised by their Grandparents in Pantla, just north of Ixtapa. The family is desperately poor, and they exist raising and selling macho plátanos. The children are now 10 and 13. The girl is in third grade, but the boy has not gone to school since arriving, at least five years ago. The boy helps his grandfather

work the crops and they cannot afford for him to go to school. The boy has been tested by a Mexican psychiatrist who

said that he is very smart and that both children are very nice and seem happy and healthy. The grandparents are willing for the children to be returned to the U.S. and the children would like to go back, but not without their grandparents. They do have an Aunt living somewhere in the U.S. but she is not able to be located, that they would be willing to live with.
